WHAT ARE ARCHIVES?

- * A business' archives contains records created or received by the organisation during its existence, which are considered to be of continuing value, and therefore selected to be kept permanently.
- * It can include physical material, such as paper documents, photographs, paintings or drawings, audio and film recordings.
- * Increasingly however, there are a number of born digital records, which started life in a digital format such as emails and websites, or social media, such as Twitter, Facebook or Flickr.

The Importance of Preserving Information

- * They are a great information resource as they document the history and identity of the organisation.
- * They are important as they protect the interests of individuals, the organisation, and society in general as they provide evidence of past events.

Appraising Records

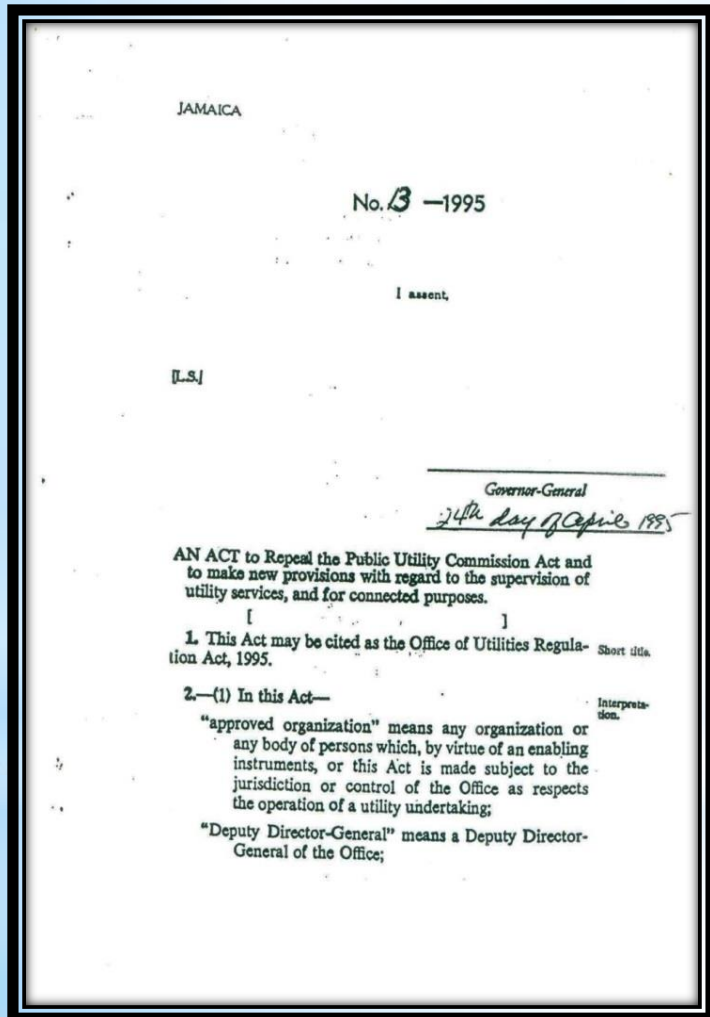
- * In deciding which records to archive, one must examine the record for its:
 - * Primary retention values by asking the question...
“does this record show evidence of the OUR’s administrative, legal or financial activities as required by law?”
 - * Secondary retention values by examining the historical or intrinsic values of the record in context of organizational or national development.

Inception (1995 - 1996)



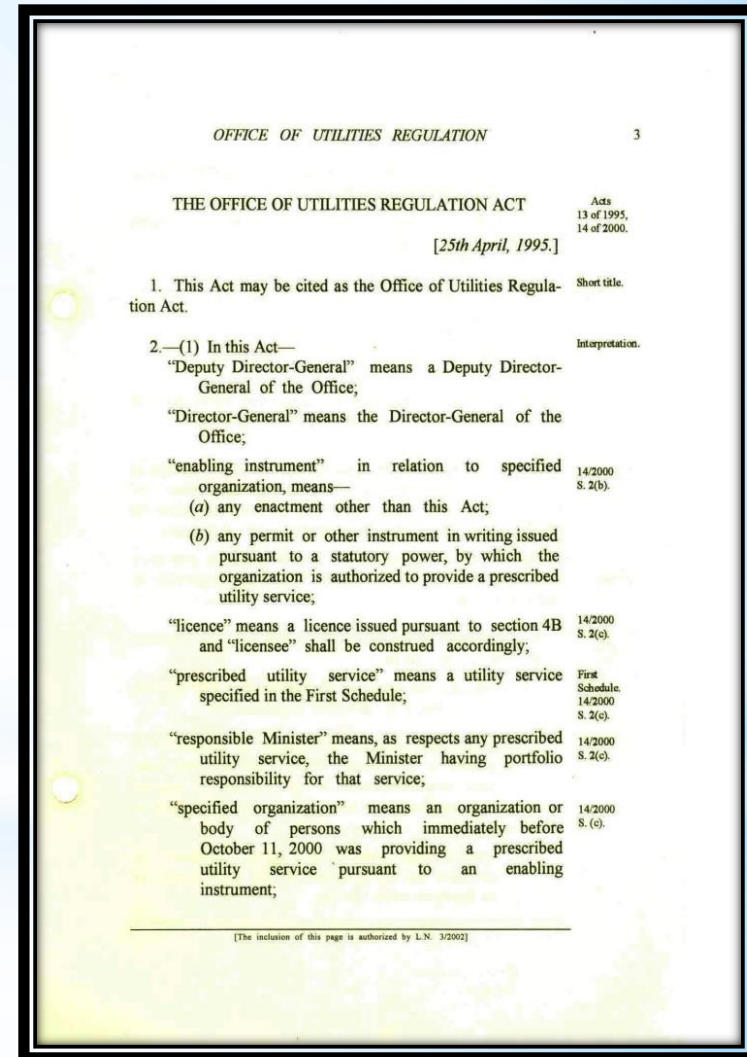
The Office of Utilities Regulation (OUR) was established by an Act of Parliament in 1995 to regulate the operations of utility companies. The Act was signed on April 24, 1995 by Sir Howard Cooke, Governor General, Jamaica.

Inception (1995 - 1996)

In 2000, the OUR Act was amended. Changes to the Act included:

- The addition of transmission and generation of electricity as a prescribed utility service
- The introduction of secrecy provisions creating stringent confidentiality requirements on officers of the OUR
- Expansion in the powers of the OUR to give directions to and require remedial measures by regulated entities for *inter alia* the protection of consumer interest and encouragement of competition
- Increase in the fines for some criminal offences under the Act

Inception (1995 - 1996)



Mr Earl Richards was appointed by The Honourable Robert D. Pickersgill, Minister of Public Utilities and Transport to undertake the preparatory work for the establishment of the OUR. The task took on a degree of urgency when the Government announced its intention to privatise JPSCo by way of the sale of majority shares.



Mr Richards was supported by Ms Clara Johnson who was later appointed Executive Secretary to the first Director General Mr Winston Hay in 1997.

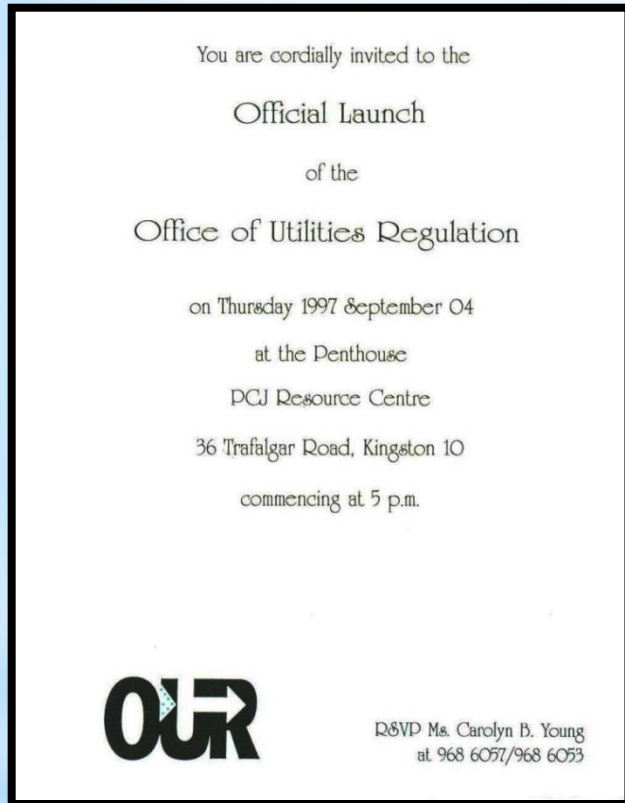

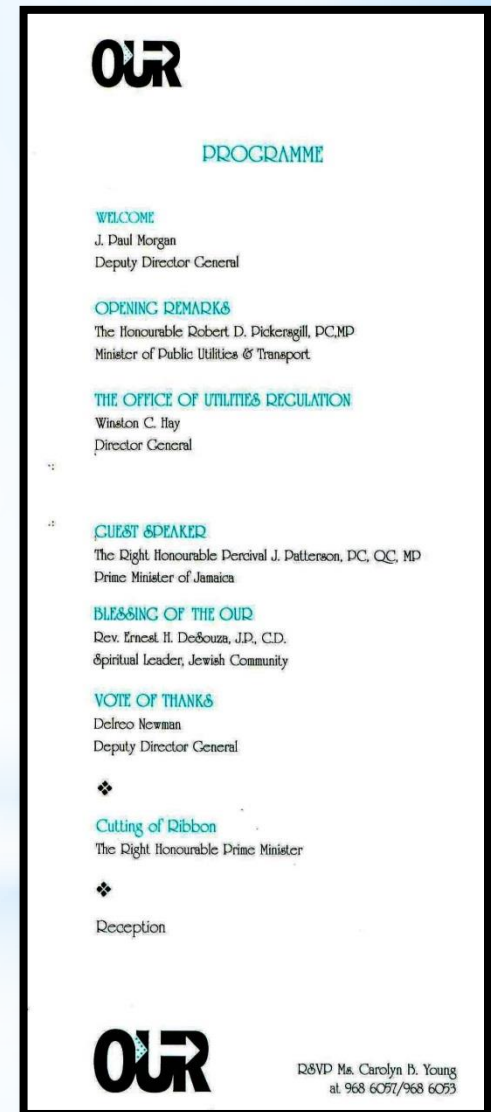

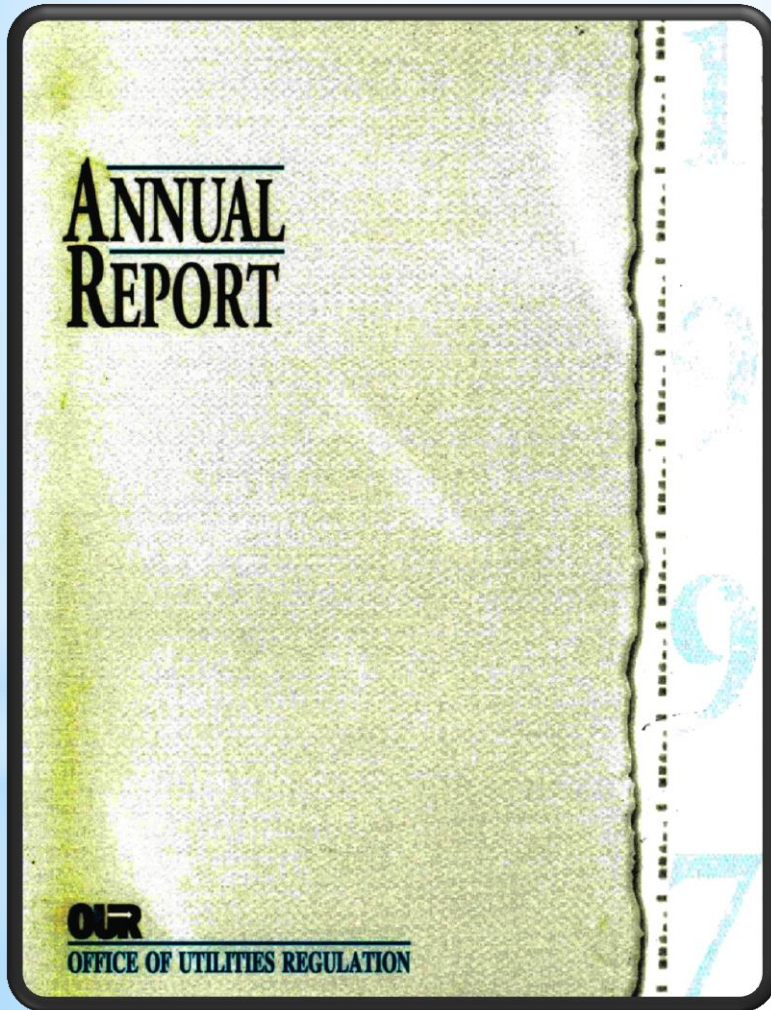

Environment”***

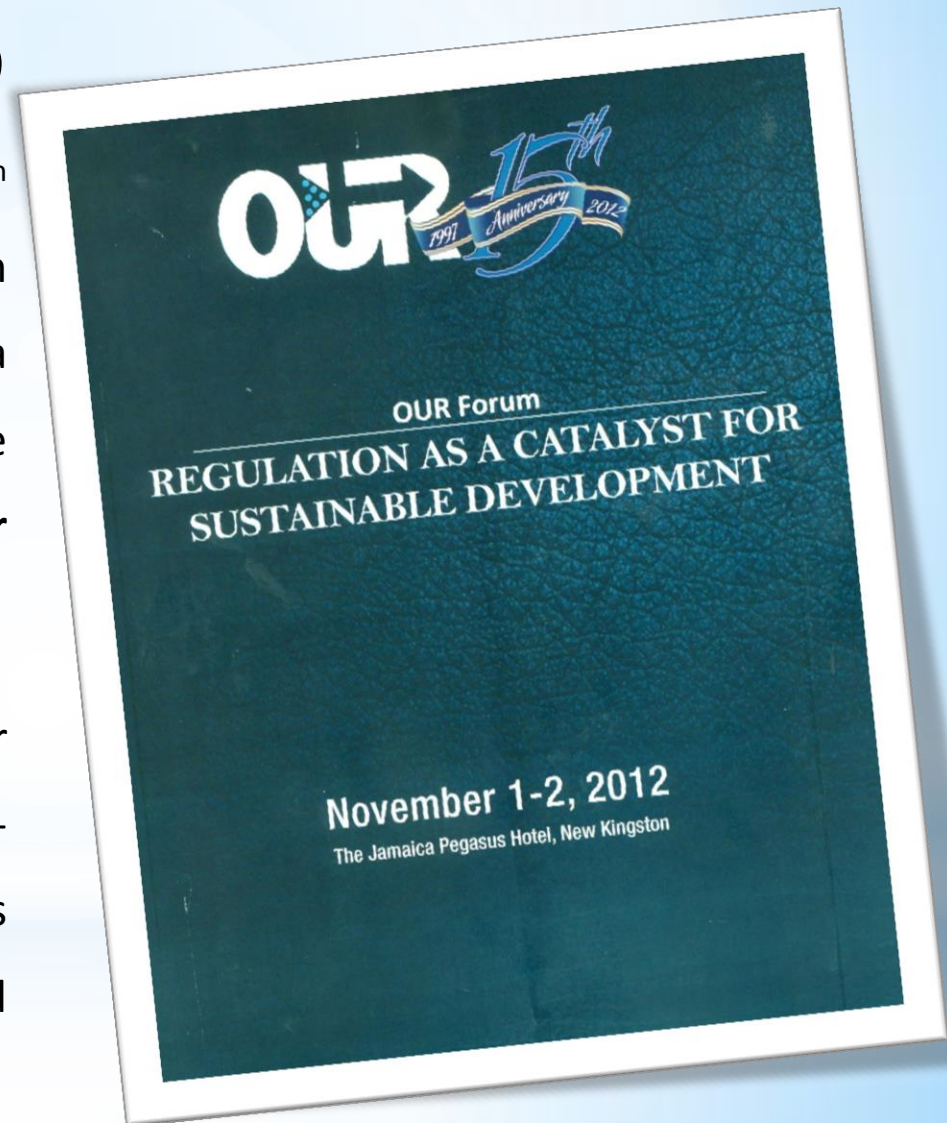
