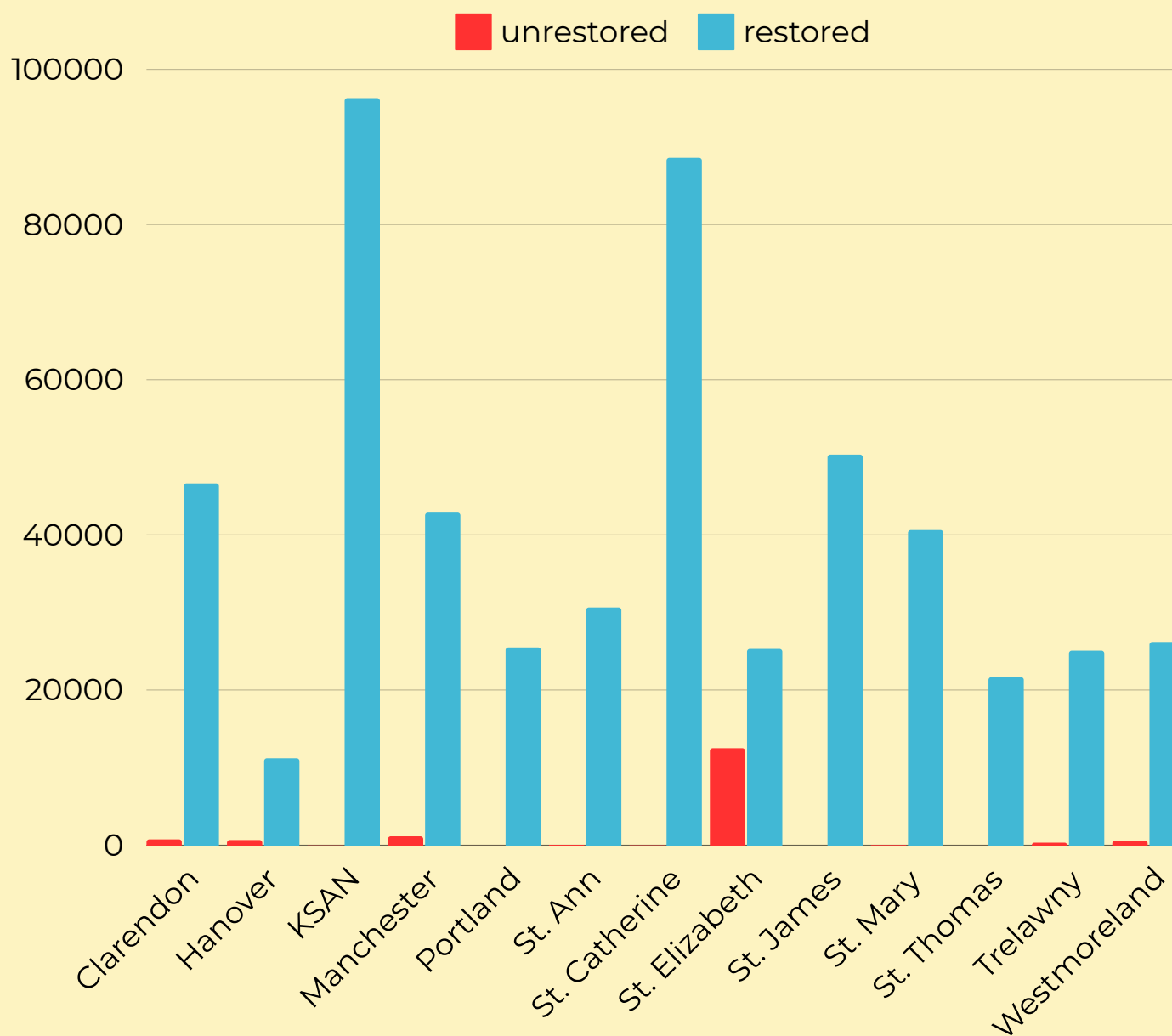




OUR Restoration Monitoring Report

As at August 6 JPS restored 97.67 per cent of the country's power supply. A total of 16,118 customers are still without power.





OUR Restoration Monitoring Report

As the regulator, the OUR is aware of its obligation to protect the interests of consumers of electricity as well as being mindful of JPS's obligations to ensure the reliability, adequacy, safety and efficiency of the service that it provides to the public. As part of its responsibility to hold JPS accountable to provide uninterrupted service or restoration at the earliest time, the OUR has directed the power company to restore electricity supply to 100 per cent of its customers by 2024 August 12.
