

JPS RESTORATION UPDATES

HIGHLIGHTS

The OUR notes progress in electricity restoration efforts across the island as JPS continues repair work in the eastern parishes with less severe damage.

- Over 140,000 customers have been reconnected.
- Power supply restored to some customers in Clarendon.
- Twelve major hospitals are now back on electricity.
- LNG facilities at SJPC and Excelerate Energy CHP are fully operational.



RESTORATION STATUS

Electricity restoration efforts are progressing across several parishes as JPS continues repair work alongside ongoing damage assessments.

As of 8:00 a.m. on **Saturday, November 1,** more than **140,000 customers** in **Kingston & St Andrew, St Catherine, St Thomas, and Clarendon** have been reconnected. The number of customers without power has fallen to *57.79%, down from 77%* at the start of the restoration.



The transmission line to Porus in Manchester has been restored, with continued work to reconnect Mandeville Regional and Hargreaves Hospitals and three NWC pumps at Porus, Broadleaf, and Comfort.


Power has also been restored to twelve major hospitals across affected parishes, including KPH, Victoria Jubilee, Princess Margaret, Bustamante for Children, UHWI, Spanish Town, Linstead, and May Pen Hospitals.

RESTORATION TIMELINE

JPS has provided updated restoration targets for parishes with less severe damage.

- Kingston & St Andrew: 90% of customers expected to be restored by midnight, Sunday, November 2.
- **St Thomas: 95%** of customers expected to be restored by midnight, **Sunday, November 2.**
- **St Catherine: 75%** of customers expected to be restored by midnight, **Sunday, November 2.**

Customers who remain without power after this time are primarily in remote or inaccessible areas or in locations where the network sustained significant damage.



SYSTEM STATUS

As of 8:00 a.m., approximately 514 MW of generation capacity is available to meet a forecasted peak demand of 300 MW at 3:00 p.m.



• Renewables: No output is currently available from solar or wind plants. The Constant Spring Hydro facility was brought back online on October 31, generating 0.53 MW.

Natural Gas: Excelerate Energy's
natural gas facility is now operational,
and both LNG plants — SJPC and
Excelerate Energy CHP (Clarendon
CHP) — are back online and
contributing to the grid.
