### HIGHLIGHTS

Since the passage of Hurricane Melissa, JPS reports that approximately 80 percent of customers across the island now have service.



### RESTORATION STATUS

### JPS restoration highlights over the last twenty four hours include:

- In St Ann, the corridor from Runaway Bay to Orange Valley was energised.
- In Manchester, FLOW and Digicel cell sites in Walderston were restored.
- In St Elizabeth, the Yardley Chase community regained service.
- In Clarendon, McNie Primary School was restored.


### RESTORATION STATUS

#### **Hospitals with Electricity Restored**

Electricity has been restored to several key medical facilities islandwide, ensuring continuity of healthcare services and support for critical operations. The following hospitals across multiple parishes have been fully energized:



### SYSTEM STATUS



From the OUR's perspective, based on updates JPS has reported:

Restoration of critical facilities that depend on JPS power continues to advance.

- Digicel: JPS has reported 68
   percent of its powered critical sites
   restored.
- FLOW: 65 percent restored.
- National Water Commission (NWC):
   78 percent restored.

Overall, JPS has reported that 70 percent of all JPS-powered critical facilities have been restored islandwide.
